Featured Case: Hoggle Children

On September 7, 2014, Sarah Grace Hoggle, 3, and her brother Jacob Gabriel Hoggle, 2, disappeared from Darnestown, Maryland.

Their father, Troy Turner, woke on the morning of September 8 to discover only his eldest son home. His girlfriend, Catherine Hoggle, and two younger children, were missing. Catherine later returned home without Sarah and Jacob. Catherine was charged with killing her children, but the charges were dropped when she was found incompetent for trial. The children have not been found. Catherine denies harming her children and asserts they are "safe".

Private Investigations for the Missing continues to accept intake requests for new cases and follows a screening process to determine eligibility. Cases that are screened in are assigned a case manager and investigator. PIFTM also provides victim and family advocacy services.
